Program Overview

Workforce Housing Development Program (WHDP) targets small to midsize communities in Greater Minnesota with rental workforce housing needs. Deferred, forgivable loans are available through a competitive request for proposal process (RFP).

- Market rate program
- Applicants are cities, communities or Minnesota Tribal entities
- Can apply for up to 50% of a projects total development costs (TDC)
- Must provide a commitment of matching funds, at a minimum, of half of what is requested from the program
- Simplistic application process

Program Updates and Changes

General Eligibility

- A home rule charter or statutory city ~~with a population exceeding 500~~ located outside of a Metropolitan County
- ~~A community that has a combined population of 1,500 residents located within 15 miles of a home rule charter or statutory city located outside a Metropolitan County~~
- ~~An area located outside of a Metropolitan County that serves A Tribal Community or Tribal Reservation governed by a federally recognized Indian Tribe in Minnesota. or their associated Tribally Designated Housing Entity as defined by United States Code, title 25, section 4103(22), as approved in writing by Minnesota Housing~~
- An area served by a Joint County-City Economic Development Authority

Funds Disbursement

- 1st disbursement of awarded funds available upon Deferred Loan Agreement execution, closing, and commencement of project construction
- 2nd disbursement of awarded funds available at 50 % construction completion
- 3rd disbursement of awarded funds available upon project completion

Eligibility Requirements

Eligible Recipients

- A home rule charter or statutory city located outside of a Metropolitan County
- A Tribal Community or Tribal Reservation governed by a federally recognized Indian Tribe in Minnesota.
- An area served by a Joint County-City Economic Development Authority

Eligibility Requirements

Eligible Housing Types

- Market Rate Residential Rental Properties to serve employees of a business or businesses located in an Eligible Project Area
- Manufactured homes
- Modular homes

Eligibility Requirements

Eligible Activities

- New construction
- Acquisition and rehabilitation of a property that creates new housing units. WHDP would only fund those new units of housing.
- Adaptive reuse of an existing property that is not currently used for housing

Eligibility Requirements

Qualified Expenditures are project related costs resulting in the direct development of new Market Rate Residential Rental Properties.

- Includes infrastructure
- No commercial space or reserves

Funding and Application Requirements

Statutory Requirements

- Eligible Project Area: Small-to medium-sized cities in Greater Minnesota or areas serving an Indian Tribe in Greater Minnesota
- Project Area Rental Vacancy Rate: At or below 5% for at least the prior two-year period
- Eligible Uses: Funds will be used on Qualified Expenditures (refer to eligibility requirements above)
- Match: Secured matching funds of one dollar for every two dollars requested in funding
- Community Need: One or more letters of support from a local business/business that employ a minimum of 20 full-time employees in aggregate
- Maximum Award Amount: Funding request does not exceed 50% of the project's total development costs

Threshold Criteria

- The application must be complete and include the following items from the Application Checklist: Application Narrative, Workbook, Certification Form, Evidence of Site Control, Self Scoring Worksheet, Wage Theft Disclosure and Wage Theft Verification.
- The application must be submitted by the deadline.

Selection Criteria

The Self Scoring Worksheet outlines the competitive selection criteria. This worksheet must be completed by the applicant and submitted as part of the Application Checklist. The project will also be scored by Minnesota Housing.

to be considered for funding

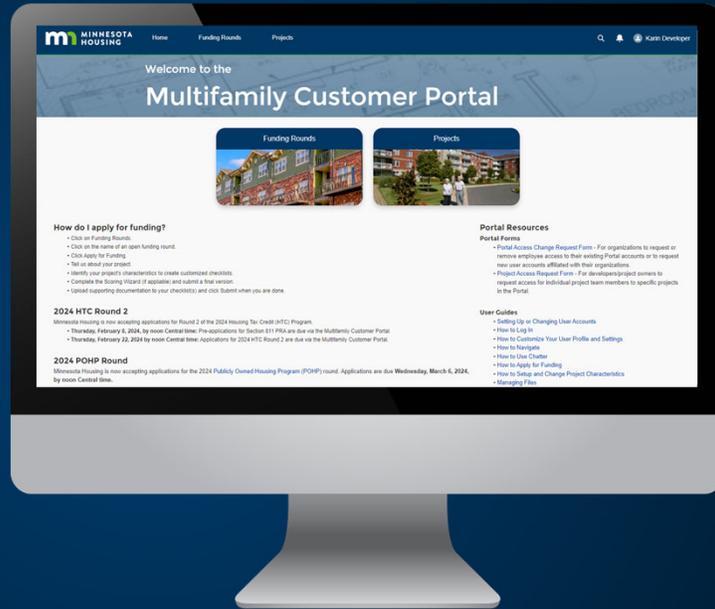
- It is strongly recommended that applicants submit their application at least 48 hours before the deadline and during regular business hours

The Multifamily Customer Portal (Portal) is a platform for developers and property managers working on affordable rental housing projects in Minnesota.

Who can use the Portal?

- **Development Teams:** Easily submit applications and manage the post-selection process for financing from Minnesota Housing's rental housing loan programs.
- **HUD Section 8 & 811 Owners/Agents:** Submit Special Claims packets electronically for efficient processing.

Note: The Multifamily Customer Portal is a separate system from the [Property Online Reporting Tool \(PORT\)](#) used for income and rent compliance reporting for HOME, National Housing Trust Fund, housing tax credits, and deferred loan programs.

Does your organization need a Portal account?

- **New Organizations:** If your organization is new to the Portal, request an account by completing our [online form](#). Be sure to include your organization's contact information and a list of staff members who need access. **NOTE:** Allow up to two business days for your account request to be processed. Once user accounts are activated, users will receive an email from mhfa-stf@crm.mn.gov to set up a password.
- **Existing Organizations:** If your organization already has a Portal account, but you don't have access, use the [Portal Access Change Request Form](#) to request individual user login credentials.

Multifamily Customer Portal Resources

The Multifamily Customer Portal (Portal)* facilitates the application and post-selection process for developers seeking funding from Minnesota Housing for affordable rental housing. It is also used by HUD Section 8 and Section 811 Based Rental Assistance owners and management agents to submit [Special Claims](#) packets.

The Portal is a web-based application built on the Salesforce platform. The recommended browser is Google Chrome. [Download Google Chrome for free.](#)

***NOTE:** This is a different system than the Property Online Reporting Tool (PORT) that is used to certify to Minnesota Housing that property owners have complied with the income, rent, and other restrictions of the financing it receives from HOME, National Housing Trust Fund, housing tax credits, or Minnesota Housing deferred loan programs.

Contractual Requirements

All applicants awarded funding will be required to:

- Sign a Deferred Loan Agreement with Minnesota Housing
- Pay the WHDP fee of \$7,000
- Provide a Payment Information Form
- Provide a Prevailing Wage Certification if the project is subject to Prevailing Wage
