#### **Supportive Housing Changes**

- Homelessness Eligibility Change
  - Long-term Homeless is changed to:

High Priority Homeless (HPH) – prioritized for supportive housing by the Coordinated Entry system

- No bonus points
- Increased points for numbers of units for HPH
- Increased points for number of units for people with disabilities
- Rental assistance points

#### **Supportive Housing Requirements**

Applications must include the following:

- Supportive Housing Narrative signed
- Continuum of Care (CoC) Confirmation Form
- Human Services Confirmation Letter
- Service Provider Qualification Form (215A)
- Workbook:
  - o Demographics: Permanent Supportive Housing
  - o Housing income tab: Indicate "HPH" units

#### **Supportive Housing Threshold Requirements**

- Support services minimum staffing hours
- Experienced service provider
- Service funding commitments
- Coordinated Entry referrals

Evidence provided in the narrative, service provider qualification form and funding commitment documents

## Housing Support (formerly GRH)

- Using Housing Support for tenant rents
  - Eligible population is extremely low-income adults with a disabling condition
  - Contact county early in development planning process
  - Underwriting standards
- Using Housing Support for services
  - Tenants must be long-term homeless
- Training session on May 2 at 9:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m.

#### **Coordinated Entry**

- Local CoC administers process
- What is it?
  - Coordinated access: A central point of access for people seeking assistance
  - Assessment: All people seeking assistance are assessed for service needs
    - Service need determined by assessment
    - Centralized waiting list prioritized by need
    - All referrals must come from the waiting list

#### People with Disabilities

- Points for units set aside and rented to People with Disabilities
- Available under "Greatest Need" selection priority
- Cannot be the same units as the Supportive Housing units for people experiencing homelessness
- Must have service agreement with county or tribal human services or a service provider
- Complete the narrative for People with Disabilities
- Threshold Criteria
- Rent subsidy or underwrite rents at Supportive Housing standard

#### Minnesota Olmstead Plan and HCBS Rule

#### Olmstead Plan

- Most integrated setting so that People with Disabilities can:
  - Live independently, close to family and friends, engage in productive employment and participate in community life
- Choice and Independence
  - Have a lease and control of unit, freedom to come and go and have visitors, and choice of services and service provider
- Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Rule
  - Potential isolating settings triggers
    - More than 25 percent of units
    - Providing multiple services on site
