 - Bergin will discuss his experience and learnings from filming the Jim Crow documentary.
- Kirsten Delegard, co-director/co-founder of the Mapping Prejudice Project
 - Mapping Prejudice, based at the University of Minnesota, identifies and maps racial covenants - clauses that were inserted into property deeds to keep people who were not White from buying or occupying homes.
- Libby Starling, director of community development and engagement at the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis
 - Starling will present recent research findings documenting higher mortgage loan denial rates for Black borrowers in the Twin Cities compared to borrowers of other races, even after adjusting for differences in borrower and loan characteristics.
